This week – In Crenver Class the children have used different map scales to calculate the actual distances between cities in the country they have chosen to research as part of their long-term Summer project. They have also located the highest peaks in their chosen countries and designed graphs to appropriately display this information. The children have also written a recount of the events in the Bible which inspired the Whitsun holiday, and word-published their stories using the laptops.

Pengelly Class – This week we have been learning about and using directions. We made up our own 'Naughty Elephant Squirts Water' to help us remember which order the compass goes in. Then we made our own treasure maps and 'picto-maps' to set challenging direction puzzles for our friends. In Literacy, we had to make our own marking ladders to go along with our descriptive writing. It was quite difficult because we had to remember to include all the features of great writing.

**Trenoweth Class** – This week our class have been working on our descriptive writing, making sure that we use really interesting vocabulary. We looked at two contrasting pictures of the sea – a calm sea and a stormy sea, and then described what we could see and hear. Afterwards, we did some great paintings of these scenes.

Releath Class - This week Releath have been learning about money and recognising the coins, they were able to add some together. They have all had their individual next steps to be working on in Maths. They have also all written a great story based on "How to Catch a Star". We have been making space music in groups and performing it to the class, the children were great at telling their friends what they liked about their music.

**SATs** – This year we had two children entered for Level 6 Mathematics papers. Bronwen and Molly attempted questions like the ones below:

'Alfie's brother left home **10** minutes **before** Alfie. He arrived at school **20** minutes **after** Alfie. He walked at a **constant speed** for all of his journey. At what time did Alfie overtake his brother?'

'Megan has a bag containing white counters and black counters.

There are 20 counters in the bag altogether. The probability of choosing a **white** counter from the bag is 0.75.

- a) How many white counters are there in the bag?'
  - Megan adds more **black** counters to the bag.
- b) How many black counters must she add so that the probability of choosing a white counter is 0.25?
