School Context

Crowan is a small rural school consisting of around 100 students located in the village of Praze-an-Beeble. Most of the students come from the village and surrounding area. Crowan has only 4 classes, reception, year 1 and 2, year 3 and 4 and years 5 and 6. The mixed age classes range from 26 – 33 children. Crowan’s ethnicity is that of a typical Cornish, rural school but does include a small percentage of diversity in its population.
